Montserrat is known as one of the best places for birding in the East Caribbean, and for good reason. Its wide variety of habitats means that it attracts a huge range of species, from the commonly seen pelican to the rarely spotted Red-Footed Booby. The students were taught how to identify a number of species, the threats that they face and learnt a host of fun facts.
